East Moore Project Update

The East Moore Project "Re-vegetation of Natural Drainage Lines and Protection of Remnant Vegetation in the East Moore Catchment" is well into its implementation phase.

Currently project participants are putting up fences to protect their remnant bushland & creek lines. Seedlings have also been ordered for re-vegetating these creek lines and sites are being prepared for tree planting. This work is helping the project meet one of its main objectives which is to 'fence off high priority natural drainage lines and re-vegetate them with native, local species and salt land species, to form a link between remnants.'

Another milestone being achieved is the establishment of photo points at project sites. These points are recorded with a GPS for downloading onto a map for future reference. The projects name, funding body and the date the fence was erected, is written on a white cow tag and attached to a strainer. Photos will be taken again towards the end of the project by the project officer to show improvement and to evaluate works carried out. The landholder will then take one annual photo at each site as part of their Management Agreement, allowing monitoring to continue.

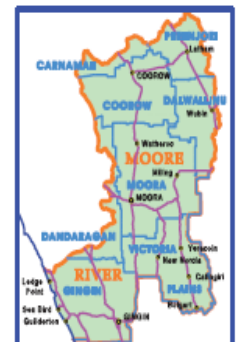
Creating Productive Saltbush Pastures on Saline Land - Update.

This project, funded by the National Landcare Program, aims to improve the profitability and agricultural sustainability of the Moora-Miling Pasture Improvement Group (MMPIG) region with 15 farmers tackling approximately 10 ha saline land on their properties by changing their farm and land management systems by planting Saltbush and Rhagodia.

The first step of the project was to complete the initial site visits to GPS the locations and to do an assessment by NRM officers, Amelia Glass and Rachel Walmsley. These have now been completed for all 15 landholders over the past couple of months and from these, maps of each site and agreements are being developed so fencing can be undertaken and seedlings planted in July/August. A field day is also being organized for the next couple of months but stay tuned for more information to follow in coming newsletters.

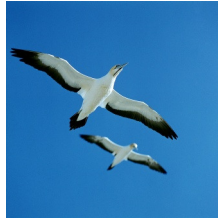

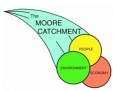

Earthworks - A Workshop for Effective Surface Water Management

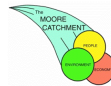
Tuesday 15th April - 8am - 1pm including lunch

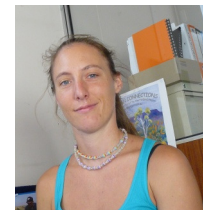
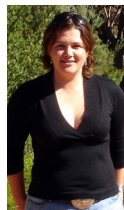
